

Voices for Justice:

Linking Women's Multimedia Stories to Public Policy for Ending Gender-Based Violence in Nepal • Political instability and civil war overshadowed gender-based violence for many years.

• Nearly 81% of rural women in Nepal report domestic violence by husbands or in-laws.

• Nepal's Domestic Violence and Punishment Act was passed in 2009, after a decade of advocacy by women's rights groups.



context

 <u>Rationale</u>: public education and advocacy for enforcement are necessary for the new law to have a real impact.

• <u>Methodology</u>: digital storytelling as a tool for healing and for bringing real women's voices into training and awareness-raising activities.

• Partners: SAATHI Nepal and Silence Speaks, an international initiative of the Center for Digital Storytelling.

- Introduce digital storytelling with samples and discussion ("Seven Steps of Digital Storytelling");
- Story Circle and script development;
- Image collection: archival; Photovoice; art making; photography/video onsite; online resources;
- Voiceover recording;
- Editing: hands-on or through storyboard consultation;
