

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Purpose

- Describe patterns of IPV among pregnant adolescents.
- Use life course analysis to examine the relationship between intimate partner violence and mental health among teens.
- Describe factors that place pregnant adolescents at risk for IPV and poor mental health outcomes.

Hypothesis

 Patterns of increased frequency and severity of IPV and trauma will be associated with an increase in mental health problems.

Violence Against Women

- Violence Against Women is a complex problem
 - Social problem
 - Criminal problem
 - Health Problem
- Rates of Violence Against Women
 - Lifetime prevalence = 33% 37% of women
 - Annual prevalence = 3 12% of women


IPV AND PREGNANCY

• Defined as

- Battering during the childbearing year
 - before the pregnancy
 - during the pregnancy
 - around the pregnancy
- Perpetrator is an intimate or former intimate partner
- Changes in pattern or type of abuse
 - During pregnancy
 - May change from physical to verbal or emotional

Patterns of IPV During Pregnancy

IPV AND PREGNANCY

- Associated with poor outcomes
 - Late entry into prenatal care
 - Increased low birth weight birth
 - Poor maternal weight gain
 - Increased preterm delivery
 - Poor adherence to medications

IPV and Mental Health

- Associated with poor outcomes
 - Depression
 - Posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD)
 - Phobias, anxiety, panic disorders
 - Substance abuse disorders
 - Post partum depression

IPV and Pregnancy among Teens

- Few studies have examined the patterns of IPV for teens during the childbearing year
 - Prenatal
 - Delivery
 - Postpartum
- Unique problems for teen moms
 - Increased partner conflict
 - Co-habitation
 - Low socioeconomic status

Domestic Violence Enhanced Home Visitation Program: **DOVE**

- Evaluation of a structured IPV Intervention
- Mothers and Infants
- 2 Study Sites: Missouri (Rural/Urban) and Baltimore (Urban)
 - Urban: Baltimore City HD
 - Urban: Missouri HD
 - Rural: Missouri HD
- Randomized clinical case control trial

Methods

- Study Design: Mixed Methods
- Recruit pregnant women w/ IPV exposure
 Up to 31 weeks gestation
- Intervention: DOVE (Structured IPV Pamphlet)
 - Visit intervention + DOVE
- ✓ DOVE Intervention Sessions
 - 3 prenatal sessions
 - 3 postpartum sessions (up to 12 weeks)
- ✓ Collect Data
 - ✓ Baseline, Delivery
 - Postpartum: 3, 6, 12, 18, 24 months
- ✓ Qualitative Interviews

Methods: Qualitative Study

- Qualitative study is a part of the larger randomized controlled trial
- A series of semi-structured qualitative interviews at baseline, delivery, 3, 6, 12, 18, and 24 months postpartum
- Conducted with a sub-sample of 13 pregnant teens from the Missouri site
- In depth face to face interviews lasting approximately one and one-half hours

Methods: Interview Guide

- Qualitative Interview Guide had 6 major sections to examine the patterns of abuse
 - Dealing with problems such as conflict, anger
 - IPV experiences before pregnancy
 - Her experiences of IPV during pregnancy
 - Family context of abuse
 - Responses to abuse
 - Barriers of the setting

Measures

- 1. IPV (AAS, WEB, CTS, SVAWS)
- 2. Maternal Mental Health
 - a. Depression: Edinburgh Depression Scale
 - **b.** PTSD: Davidson Trauma Scale
 - c. Self Esteem/Social Support: Prenatal Psychosocial Profile
- 3. Parenting
 - a. Parenting Stress Index
 - **b.** HOME : Stimulation
- 4. Infant Growth & Development
- 5. Use of Community Resources









Types of Violence



Relationship Status at Baseline, 3 Months Postpartum, and 12 Months Postpartum

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Common Characteristics

- Instability with living situation (10/13 of the teens)
 - Absent father; sometimes absent mother
 - H/O running away
 - Foster care
 - Live with partner
- Abuse as a young child (8/13 of the teens)
 - Sexual and physical
 - Family member or mother's partner
- Early mental health diagnosis/treatment and behavior problems (9/13 of the teens)
 - Diagnosed with depression
 - Treated with meds
 - Counseling
 - Behavior problems in school
- Given drugs/alcohol by abuser (3/13 of the teens)
 - Most did not report substance abuse

IPV Screening by Healthcare Provider

- 5/12 of the teens in the sub sample were screened (1 teen was not asked my interviewer)
 - Two were asked about current IPV, not past experiences
 - One reported abuse in the past, but the healthcare provider did not ask any further once the teen reported she felt safe now
 - One was only asked about sexual violence, not emotional or physical
- Advice from teens in the sub sample
 - "Don't harp on one specific subject all the time...bounce around from different subject to subject to where they're not just so overwhelmed."
 - "A lot of places will do question after question...when really all the person wants is for you to listen to them."
 - "Don't judge nobody."
 - "I'd probably just ask them if there was any situation that they felt uncomfortable in with their home life and if so, if there is any way that somebody can help, cause a lot of times people don't think of it as something they need help with."

Discussion

- Common characteristics to look for
 - Instability with living situation, physical/sexual abuse as a young child, early mental health diagnosis/treatment, and early behavior problems.
- Screening
 - Ask about past experiences as well
 - Listen without being overbearing or judgmental

Further Directions

- Examine changes in mental health and violence over time
 - 3mo, 6mo, 12mo, 18mo, 24mo
- Signs for health care providers to look for when treating pregnant adolescents
 - Existing mental health diagnoses and treatments
 - Living situation
 - History of abuse
