### What is the YRBSS? Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System

National school-based survey



- Conducted by CDC and local education and health agencies
- National YRBS data are representative of all public and private school students in grades 9-12 in the 50 states and the District of Columbia.
- N=~16,000

### **Current YRBS question:**

"During the past 12 months, did your boyfriend or girlfriend ever hit, slap, or physically hurt you on purpose?"









### Review of what we just saw:

- Physical dating violence remained stable from 1999 to 2009
- Males appear to experience as much TDV as females

## Criticisms of existing YRBS question

"During the past 12 months, did your boyfriend or girlfriend ever hit, slap, or physically hurt you on purpose?"

Issue	Explanation
Timeframe	Past year vs. ever
Type of violence	Physical only (no sexual)
Type of violence	Too few specified (choking? Punch?)
Relationship	"Boyfriend/girlfriend"

### 2011 Massachusetts question

Have you ever been hurt physically by a date or someone you were going out with? (Include being hurt by being shoved, slapped, hit, or forced into any sexual activity.)?

Issue	How different from national question
Timeframe	Ever (not past year)
Type of violence	Physical and sexual
Type of violence	More specified
Relationship	"date or someone you were going out with"
Impact	"hurt" reiterated; OR "forced into any sexual activity"
