- · Well informed and trained staff

- 24-hour crisis response
- Emergency housing
- · Transitional housing
- Legal services

- Support groups for victims
- Children's services
- Batterers' groups

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Implementation – how it's done

Each medical center has a Physician Champion and multi-disciplinary committee that:

- meets regularly
- implements the "Systems-model" in phases
- reviews quality measures and develops annual goals

All medical center committees meet with each other twice yearly for:

- leadership development
- sharing best practices
- updates on research

- review of quality metrics
- developing goals and strategy



- IPV Identification: How many members experiencing IPV are we identifying?
- Mental Health Follow-Up How many members who are identified with IPV receive MH follow-up?


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
Why measure IPV identification rather than screening rates?





IPV Identification Increasing:

Largely in primary care and mental health departments



Total Count Alone Is Not Enough

Need to measure *rates* – how many of those experiencing IPV are we identifying?



IPV Quality Data: Focus on women age 18-65

Why focus on this group?

Women age 18-65 are at highest risk for IPV

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






IPV ID Rate 2006 – 4.8%






IPV ID Rate 2007 – 5.1%






IPV ID Rate 2008 – 9.9%






IPV ID Rate 2009 – 16.1%






IPV ID Rate 2010 – 18.2%






IPV ID Rate 2011 – 20%






IPV ID Rate 2012 – 24.1%






IPV ID Rate 2013 – 36.5%






IPV ID Rate 2014 – 47.1%

Patient email illustrating need for "rooming alone"

"I need to tell you that my ankle was broken because I was attacked by my boyfriend. I'm not sure of the exact details because the whole situation as so horrific and terrorizing. He choked me and then threw me on his bed which had a wooden platform and I tried to get him off me and in the struggle somehow my leg was broken. He pulled a shotgun and then threatened to kill me. I am very fearful of him and have since reported the crime to the sheriff...



Patient email illustrating need for "rooming alone"

"...I am sorry I could not express this sooner but I thought you should know. There was never a private time to tell you. When I went to the ER the night this happened they asked me if this was domestic violence I said no because he was standing behind me. No one would say yes in front of someone who just harmed them. I'm sure the authorities will request my records and that's just fine. I'm mending well and will see you in [soon]. Have a wonderful [weekend] and thanks for all your good care."
